

### PALM SUNDAY

### **COMMUNION UNDER BOTH KINDS**

Beginning Holy Thursday, Mar 28, St Anthony will begin offering Holy Communion under both kinds again at Sunday Masses and Holy Days. As you recall, this practice was suspended during the COVID times. Last year, the bishop reinstated it.

I have sent a video to our Communion ministers with some basic information on how this will go.

The faithful, while encouraged to receive Communion under both forms, of course remain free to receive the Body only, or the Blood only, as they wish.

The 'General Instruction of the Roman Missal' (GIRM) is the official church rulebook for all things pertaining to the Mass. Among other things, the GIRM asks that the pastor make sure people know that Jesus is truly present under BOTH forms. If someone receives only one form, the sacrament is not 'less' valid. If one receives both forms, the sacrament is not 'more' valid. A person who receives both forms is not 'holier' than the person who receives one form. The faithful are given the option to receive under either form, or both.

With that being the case, then why offer Communion under both forms? Here is from the GIRM:

'Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it is distributed under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clear expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord..." (281)

There will be a brief review session for all EMHC's following all the masses on Mar 9-10 and following the 9am and 11:30am Masses on Mar 17. We will practice using the cup.

One final note on terminology: Prior to consecration, the Eucharistic elements consist of bread and wine. After the consecration, they become the Body and Blood of our dear Savior.

For this reason, we would like to avoid using the terms 'bread' or 'wine' for the consecrated elements. You will actually never receive bread or wine at a Catholic mass. That's because when you come up for Communion, the elements have changed! That's why we prefer the terms 'ciborium' and 'cup' or, if you please, 'Body' and 'Blood.'
