Preaching Christ Through the Saints

Dear Friends,

Our Catholic tradition celebrates men and women whose imitation of Christ was truly exemplary. We call these people 'saints' because they were holy, that is, like God. Their example inspires us and shows us what holiness looks like in the real world.

I believe that looking to the saints is a great way to understand the church and the Gospel.

If you want to get a sense of, say, baseball, then going to a tee-ball game of your five year old nephew, while cute, will not give you a true sense of the game. In fact, it would even be unfair to judge the game of baseball on a small subset of little league games. No...to understand baseball, it's best to watch a major league game. There you will see players performing the game at its highest level.

The same analogy holds for music, carpentry, writing, etc. We learn what an art or trade really is by watching people do it as truly intended.

The same principle is true for the spiritual life. Too often, people judge Christianity by its rather poor practitioners. The church certainly carries much negative baggage after hosting 2000 years of struggling sinners. Sometimes scoffing pundits say that the church is nothing but a bunch of hypocrites. But that is not entirely true. While the church has more than its share of hypocrites and sinners, of which you and I qualify from time to time, it has also produced men and women of outstanding Christian virtue and heroic love. Why not look to them?

The saints show us what Christianity actually looks like when truly practiced. If we take the Gospel to its logical conclusion, truly implementing its teachings and principles, what is the result? The results the saints.

For this reason, I would generally like to dedicate my preaching in 2024 to the lives of the saints. I hope to pick a saint or two from the upcoming liturgical calendar to illustrate truths of the Scriptures that we hear proclaimed at Mass each Sunday. I hope this will be helpful and fruitful for you. I'm looking forward to this project!
